Message from the Executive Director

As the Executive Director at St. Leonard's Community Services London & Region, I am very proud to be a part of such an amazing organization as we celebrate our 50th year. The very first directors of the organization, Hume Cronyn, Allen Henderson, and Jeffery Flinn, on January 16th, 1969, officially created what was then known as St. Leonard's House London. At that time, St. Leonard's purpose was

"to assist in the rehabilitation of persons formerly incarcerated in prisons or jails during the transition period from the time of the release of these persons to such time as they return to a normal livelihood in society and for this purpose to assist such persons in gaining employment and becoming self-supporting."

We have grown so much since then, now offering services to individuals with developmental disabilities and special needs, those experiencing chronic or persistent homelessness, youth in schools and in community settings, adults struggling with substance use issues, and those coming out of forensic hospital settings. With over 120 staff, we continue to make an impact every day.

Over the past year, our work has been guided by our strategic plan. We have continued to focus on our communications, both within the organization and externally with our partners and community. A particularly exciting project has been the refresh of our corporate website: working with staff from different parts of the organization, as we decided on our messaging for the new website, was a great opportunity to really understand who we are and what we do. Employees across our different programs provided services to almost 7,000 individuals and we had over 20,000 client visits in our community-based programs; our residential centres had almost 17,000 resident days during the year!

As we prepare for the year to come, one of our biggest opportunities will be the ongoing planning for accreditation: with the landscape around us continually evolving as a result of provincial, federal, and municipal elections, demonstrating our accountability to that high standard of service delivery and promoting a culture of quality and innovation will help to ensure that St. Leonard's is able to continue to deliver on our vision of promotion of positive change and contributing to a safer and healthier community.

And, of course, we could not accomplish all this without the efforts of the dedicated staff, consultants, volunteers and students who are so committed to the work we do. Every day I am inspired by being able to work alongside such an exceptional group of people!




SLCS is committed to continuously improving its capacity related to French Language Services.

SLCS By The Numbers

- 9,470 Client visits in the Reintegration Program
- 7,209 Support days provided to clients in SIL
- 4,474 Participants in Peer Power workshops and training
- 2,209 Hours provided to youth in the Intensive Reintegration programs

 - Percentage of youth successfully completing the Extrajudicial Sanctions program
